* For STUDENT: This **Thursday, April 12th**, Andover High’s Gay Straight Alliance asks you to participate in the *Day of Silence*. Throughout the United States, people have been gathering to stop the isolation experienced by people based on their sexual orientation. To participate in the *Day of Silence*, we ask you to take a vow of silence to recognize and protest the discrimination and harassment experienced by lesbian, gay and transgendered people and their allies. Please be aware, that if a teacher has scheduled you to participate in an activity as part of your course, you will be expected to do so.

If you feel that you would be unable to keep a vow of silence, you may still participate in the Day of Silence by being a vocal supporter. Vocal supporters speak out specifically on the *Day of Silence* to protest the silence faced by lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgendered people and their allies.

Last year, over 150 members of the AHS community participated in this event. We hope this year to have even more join in. Please consider standing with those who have no voice. See Ms. Burch or Mr. Sousa if you wish to participate in this year’s Day of Silence. Students will be in the cafeteria during all lunches starting on Tuesday, April 10th so that you can sign up for the day of silence.
