\*High school junior and senior students are invited to participate in the 2013 Religious Liberty Essay Scholarship Contest. The subject is: "Using the Constitution and writings of the Founders, research and evaluate the claim that the United States was founded as a Christian nation." There are no requirements involving GPA, faith, or activities. The first place winner will receive a \$2,000 scholarship and a trip for two to Washington, D.C. Second place - \$1,000, and third place \$250. Submission deadline is **March 1, 2013**. \*The American Legion is sponsoring the "High School Oratorical Scholarship Program," a constitutional speech contest for high school students who are citizens of or lawful permanent U.S. residents. The purpose: to develop a deeper knowledge and appreciation of the US Constitution, as well as to develop leadership skills, the ability to think and speak clearly and intelligently, and the preparation for acceptance of duties, responsibilities, rights and privileges of American citizenship. The top prize at the state level is \$1,000 plus an additional \$1,500 when the contestant participates in the national competition. The national awards are \$18,000, \$16,000 and \$14,000 for placing first, second and third. The
