To participate in the *Day of Silence*, we ask you to take a vow of silence to recognize and protest the discrimination and harassment experienced by lesbian, gay and transgendered people and their allies. Please be aware, that if a teacher has scheduled you to participate in an activity as part of your course, you will be expected to do so. If you feel that you would be unable to keep a vow of silence, you may still participate in the Day of Silence by being a vocal supporter. Vocal supporters speak out specifically on the *Day of Silence* to protest the silence faced by lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgendered people and their allies. Last year, over 175 members of the AHS community participated in this event. We hope this year to have even more join in. Please consider standing with those who have no voice.
