*Boston University will offer its Summer Pathways program during the July 11-18, 2014. Summer Pathways, now in its eighth year, is an exciting seven-day, residential program for high school girls entering their junior or senior year in September 2014. The program targets girls from Boston area high schools who show promise and/or interest in science, math, or engineering. Summer Pathways includes an overnight on the historic Roseway, a 137 schooner built in 1925. Tuition is \$675 and includes room, board, all travel and activities. Scholarships of up to \$575 are available to students with demonstrated financial need. Participants live in a BU dormitory, and during this week engage in many hands-on science activities and gain first hand knowledge of a wide range of careers in STEM disciplines. Participants also visit laboratories, listen to career panels, visit local companies, and learn about the college admissions process. On the Roseway, they will learn about marine life, the physics of sailing, and be active participants alongside the crew.
