### Reminders:

1. Doors lock at 8 am
2. You must have both your photo ID and your admission ticket with the properly uploaded photo to test Saturday morning. Keep in mind, as has been the policy for two years, driver's permits are NOT acceptable identification. Students will not be allowed to test if either form of documentation is missing or unacceptable. \*\*This documentation MUST be with you before the doors lock at 8 AM. The staff will not run around retrieving students' missing documentation from frantic parents after the doors have locked. It is the student's responsibility to come prepared and be on time. \*\*

If you do not have a license, passport, or student ID, please see your guidance counselor ASAP for a college-board identification letter. This letter must meet the CB's specific requirements, which include a photo as one of the specification.
