Events for Science:

The MIT Beaver Works Summer Institute (BWSI) Online Educational Program

Nomination for students is now open for 2020! The Beaver Works Summer Institute is pleased to announce that we will have 10 program offerings for summer 2020.

This curriculum is available online as a series of self-paced units for students to follow independently. The content is the prerequisite material for participation in the 2019 BWSI Program, which will be taught at a higher level and will address more research-oriented technologies, techniques, tools, and applications. Your participation and performance in the online curriculum will be one of the metrics used to determine acceptance into the 4-week program being held the summer 2020 at MIT in Cambridge, MA. Detailed information on the program will be found in the new BWSI 2020 brochure that will be out in the next few weeks.

The courses utilize MIT's EdX platform for the materials that will be linked to educational content, lab exercises, and demonstration challenges. The online course will provide familiarity with the program's key tools, such as the Robot Operating System (ROS, <http://ros.org>) running on the Ubuntu distribution of the GNU/Linux operating system. The online course will also develop programming skills with the Python programming language and will provide students valuable experience with the OpenCV (open computer vision) tools widely used in industry and academic research. In addition, the available core units in control systems, computer vision, localization, navigation, and planning will closely follow the learning sequence of previous year's curriculum.
