# Testing History

- 2012 13 MCAS in all grades 3 8, and 10
- 2013 14 PARCC Pilot in some grades in some schools 3 8. MCAS in grade 10; PARCC scores not reported
- 2014 15 PARCC in all schools; Some computer-based; MCAS in grade 10;
  District is held harmless to its 2014 level.
- 2015 16 PARCC in all grades 3 8, Bancroft Computer Based; All other schools paper-pencil; MCAS grade 10
- 2016 17 MCAS 2.0 in all grades 3 8 and grade 10; Computer-based pilot in grades 4, BYOD Pilot in grade 8, all other grades are paper/pencil.

- Level 5: Exceeded expectations
- Level 4: Met expectations
- Level 3: Approached expectations
- Level 2: Partially met expectations
- Level 1: Did not meet expectations

# PARCC Highlights – All students G 3 - 8

- There was overall improvement in ELA scores in the aggregate from 2015 to 2016
  - + High Needs, + Students with disabilities, + Economically disadvantaged, + ELLs
- Similar results in Math as well
  - + High Needs, + Students with disabilities, +Economically disadvantaged, + ELLs
- Title I results in both ELA and Math for all students showed no improvement
- District comparison
  - We rank second in ELA and second in math.

# Elementary Grades 3 - 5

- ELA
  - A 1% decrease in the percent of students scoring a Level 4 or Level 5.
    - ELLs and Former ELLs showed an increase in 7 percentage points
    - 3 % decrease in the percent of students scoring a Level 4 or Level 5 in the disability subgroup
- Math
  - Students scoring a Level 4 or Level showed no difference
    - ELLs and Former ELLs showed an increase in 15 percentage points
    - African Am/Black students showed an increase of 13 percentage points

#### MCAS Science G 5 and G 8

- Grade 5
  - Overall decrease in student scoring Advanced or Proficient from 76.0 in 2014 to 62.6% in 2016.
- Grade 8
  - Overall decrease in student scoring Advanced or Proficient from 59.8% in 2014

#### Middle Grades 6 - 8

- ELA
  - Improvement in students scoring a Level 4 or Level 5 between 2015 and 2016 for all students and in most sub-groups and in all ethnicity categories
    - Students with disabilities showed an increase of 19 percentage points
    - Students who are economically disadvantaged showed an increase of 7 percentage points
    - There was a decrease of 6 percentage points for our ELL students
- Math
  - Improvement in students scoring a Level 4 or Level 5 between 2015 and 2016 for all students and in most sub-groups and in all ethnicity categories
    - With the exception of the ELL subgroup, each showed an increase between 6 and 8 percentage points

# MCAS High School Summary

- Students scoring either proficient or advanced in ELA is 97.9%
  - We rank #3 in our comparable schools data
- Students scoring either proficient or advanced in Math is 93.6%
  - We rank #2 in our comparable schools data
- Students scoring either proficient or advanced in Science is 84.0%
