\*Any student interested in participating in the USA Biology Olympiad will want to know that the first round of this academic competition will take place after school on **Wednesday, February 8th**. The USA biology Olympiad is a 50-minute, nationwide multiple-choice exam available to any high school student who is registered to participate. Participants with scores in the top 10% will advance to the next round. There is no fee for participation but students who would like to take the exam must register online by Tuesday, February 7th in order to participate. The 50 minute exam will be offered on **Wednesday, February 8** in room 225 beginning at 2:30 pm. This scholarship was created by the Massachusetts Legislature to identify and recruit disadvantaged high school students in the 10<sup>th</sup> or 11<sup>th</sup> grades who display strong academic promise but whose socio-economic background and environmental conditions may inhibit their ability to attain a post secondary education and degree. Each year, 25 deserving students are selected as Herter recipients. Scholarships may be awarded for a maximum of 4 years. Andover High can nominate 2 students. Applications are available in the Counseling Office. **Deadline is March 1, 2012.**

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\* The Mark Bavis Leadership Foundation has established a scholarship for all high school students in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to be used for school tuition, summer programs, and other appropriate extracurricular activities. This award ranges from \$1,000 to \$5,000. Mark Bavis was a victim of the terrorist attack on September 11, 2001. This scholarship was established to preserve his memory and perpetuate the principles by which he lived. It is not academically based, but is awarded on the basis of need. In addition, the committee will give more serious consideration to those students who have made efforts to make a difference in their communities and/or have shown leadership qualities within their school.
