Herter Memorial Scholarship for disadvantaged high school students in the 10<sup>th</sup> or 11<sup>th</sup> grades who display strong academic promise but whose socio-economic background and environmental conditions may inhibit ability to attain a post secondary education and degree. \*The American Legion, Department of Massachusetts, is again sponsoring the “High School Oratorical Scholarship Program,” a constitutional speech contest. All contestants shall be required to deliver a prepared oration, which must be the original effort of the contestant, and must require not less than eight nor more than ten minutes for delivery. At the state level, the top prize is \$1,000 plus an additional \$1,500 when contestant participates in the national competition. National scholarship awards are \$18,000, \$16,000 and \$14,000 (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, & 3<sup>rd</sup> awards). Complete information is available in the Counseling Office.
