*All students are invited to participate in the USA Biology Olympiad Open Exam being administered after school on Tuesday, February 2 (Ground Hog's Day!) in room 225. The open exam round consists of a 50 minute, 40 question multiple choice exam comprised of questions about a wide range of topics in biology. High scorers will be invited to participate in the next round of the Olympiad in March. The Olympiad process will ultimately select a team of students from across the USA to represent the USA in the International Biology Olympiad this summer in Hanoi, Vietnam. The open exam is free but participating students must register online by this Friday, January 22, 2016 to participate - the registration web site is posted in the bulletin (<https://www.usabo-trc.org>) and in biology classrooms. ***Contest:** Students in grades 6–12 can enter the 2016 Drive2Life Contest to help prevent distracted walking.

Each participating student must create a storyboard or written script for a 30-second public service announcement (PSA) to help prevent distracted walking.

One Grand Prize student winner will receive \$1,000 and a trip to New York City to work with an Emmy-winning director to turn his or her vision into a 30-second PSA. Plus, the winner will be featured on the nationally broadcast TV show *Teen Kids News* and in select Scholastic magazines.
